Other projects

In Germany exists the "duales System": a dual system where your professional skills are based on a solid structure of theory and practice, mixed together. In Italy the system is different but none the less we have "alternanza scuola lavoro": the alternation of school (the lessons are theoretical) but also of work (so the practical side). In my lyceum the linguistic course isn't obliged to do it, nevertheless the most part of the students join it. It is possible also to can't take part to the alternation (for instance because of bad marks or inappropriate behavior). Minimum 60 hours are required. At the contrary, in the pedagogical course of Cevolani the system is compulsory: in the third year you have to work only one week but you don't go to the normal school lessons, in the 4th year you have to study and practice 60 hours. This is one of the most useful projects in my school, because after the period of work you may have an idea of what are you good for.

Another project I made is Comenius, where Germany and France made cultural exchanges with Italy: it was an excellent experience, like Erasmus.

All the projects I made formed the person I am. Everytime I have to take part on a project I am full of energy, motivation and desire to learn; the competition between the students helps me a lot to give always my best.

19th-25th April: the week

Day 1

The 19th of April the German delegation arrived at about 19 o'clock: Maximilian Stadler, german boy, was my exchange student. We received information about what would we had to do the next day and the programs of the week. Then I returned home with Maximilian and we introduced ourselves (nevertheless, at first was very embarrassing, and we talked not a lot). Day 2

The second day I took Maxi with me and we went to school. At 8 o'clock we were in my classroom and we made an hour of physics, just to make him see how is the teaching system here in Italy. Then we met with the teachers and witch the others students from Germany and Latvia and we made a tour of the building: we saw the school museum and in general the school's structure and classes.

After this fast tour of the school, we met a delegate of the Cento's major (who unfortunately could not be there), who expressed his deep emotions and greetings for this honorable cultural exchange. What we learnt from the delegate's speech is that is not important the mere fact of "learning" and what we actually know about things: what it is really important is to feel the emotions bond in doing what we love and to make and keep the human relationships we build. This have to be our European model .



After the meeting we visited Cento and we understand his importance on a cultural, artistic and historical level. Cento is a centre full of culture: for Instance Guecino, a very well-known artist who lived during the Renaissance, made lots of beautiful paintings and gave to Cento a huge artistic contribution.

We visited also the Rocca (where there where a comics exhibition concerning the second world war); the Pandurera (the theatre of Cento, where we can see plays and musicals from well-known artists) and the main square, where we have the "palazzo del Governatore" and the Guercino's sculpture.

What we understand is the importance of Cento on an artistic point of view, visiting the historical places of interest.

At the afternoon we visited "Baltur": the most important factory of Cento, where they produce heat machines. Baltur is 65 years old. First the boss of the factory Fava explained to us how does the factory function and the characteristics of Baltur (for instance the organization chart); the range of products produced by Baltur, making evidence regarding the internationality of the company, because of their contacts all around the world (China, Japan). The three keyworls of the company are research, development, innovation.




The things we learnt are: how can I apply my skills?

The third day we went to Castelfranco Emilia at the agricultural institute "Spallanzani". Emilia Romagna is the number one in production of parmesan and balsamic vinegar. We arrived there very soon because the parmesan's processing are done before 8 a.m., in fact the process required a very long time to be finished.

The first thing we saw was the cheesemaker cutting a huge form of parmesan. The smell was delicious and also the taste. Then we moved to the small factory: the cheesemaker, that we in Italy call "casaro" (he has to be old, not young, because only years and years of experience could gave him the preparation) explained to us all the steps of the parmesan's production. He is the only "casaro" in the factory, like any other italian cheese factory.

After the explanation of production of cheese we met a teacher passionate in balsamic vinegar, who told us its story in an emotional sense of agriculture membership. It has been great, because I saw a man proud of the work he is doing and happy to found his field. The story of the Modena's vinegar began before the total women's emancipation: the men in fact gave them the old and acid wine but they, always smart, kept this

rancid wine in their attics. After years, when they discovered the wine become a delicious vinegar, we have the birth of the balsamic.

We ate at the school's canteen: the students of the institute have prepared food to us. We ate typical italian dishes and I enjoyed very much the meal, because the food was prepared by boys and girls of my age.

When we came back to Cento, we had a meeting where I interviewed my partner and we organized the homework, then we prepared ourselves to join the pizzeria, where we stayed all together before the departure of the latvish students.

Day 5

Today the german delegation visited the city of Bologna and I finally returned to school.

I hope the enjoyed Bologna, because is the most important city in Emilia Romagna.

Day 6

Today the german delegation left at 8:00, I was very sorry and sad because it was a fantastic week and I was afraid I would miss the good times we spend together.
